World Fish Migration Day Panel Event May 20, 2016 - Washington, D.C.

What:

World Fish Migration Day (WFMD) is a global-local celebration aimed at creating worldwide awareness about the importance of open rivers and migratory fish. This year marks the second WFMD and will bring together 1,500 organizations and showcase more than 400 events worldwide.

To kick off WFMD 2016 (Saturday, May 21st), a panel event will take place the day prior (Friday, May 20th) in Washington, D.C. The panel will focus on the impacts of dams and other infrastructure on fish passage, as well as increased pressure on migratory species due to climate change, overfishing and development. Expert perspectives, ranging from an Indian Nation to a development bank, will break down the complexity of these issues and present examples of innovative, collaborative solutions that can help strike a better balance for people and nature.

The event will consist of a keynote, panel, Q&A and a special announcement by U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service Director **Dan Ashe** and **Deputy Johannes Kramer**, Vice Governor of the Provincial Executive of Fryslân, The Netherlands. A cocktail reception will follow.
